to name the baby boy Dan Stewart. He was named after a trotter horse, Dan Patch, that Myrtle's father owned. He had many work horses on his farm. Myrtle loved the horses so much that she decided to name all her children after them: Dick, Dan, Nancy, Jim, Mary, and Betty.

When Dan was three, the family moved to Spooner, WI. Dan's father was a high school teacher until he retired. He and his siblings were never taught by their father. Dan shared some treasured memories with us: riding his bicycle to Siegner Hill in the summer and going sledding down that hill in the winter.
