Maple Ridge The Truth About Medicaid

Every year, hundreds of patients and residents rely on Maple Ridge Care Center to meet their medical and social needs. As a non-profit organization, we accept residents who have Medicaid insurance although the reimbursement is insufficient. The state of Wisconsin reimburses us \$41.66 less per day, per resident than what it costs us to care for them, resulting in a \$15,205.90 loss per resident each year.


